The Parish has a plan of key pavements and paths, mostly in the centre of the village, which are a priority for clearing and keeping clear when there is excessive snow and ice. The parish handymen lead on this activity, but volunteer snow wardens give extra support to get the job done quickly, for the benefit of all.

These elections are administered by Rotherham MBC and the arrangements for nominations to be a Councillor will be announced in early 2024 and will be on the Rotherham MBC website.


As a Parish Council we hope all available seats will be filled.

It's been another busy year for Winthrop! We are so fortunate to have a great team of 80+ volunteers who work so hard in the Café, Gardens and supporting us in the delivery of an increasing number of regular activities and special events. At the moment our Volunteers are busy with Festive Teas and Pop Up Cafes and Craft Fairs at the Community Centre. At this time of year it's also good to reflect on our fabulous customers and friends who support us in so many ways. Most of you will know that we have a number of buildings at Winthrop which are well past their best. As a first step to sorting this out we're delighted that we've just got planning permission for a replacement Café building.

#### Wickersley Ladies Club generous donation to the Winthrop Memory Café

The Wickersley Ladies Club have always been great supporters of the Winthrop Memory Café and their support and generosity continues. At their October meeting it was a huge surprise to receive a cheque for £1000 for the Winthrop Memory Café.

Said Winthrop Organiser, Anna Chester "This hugely generous donation reflects a lot of hard fundraising work and we are enormously grateful for it. Our now twice monthly Memory Café is popular, really well attended, thriving, with a short waiting list and is meeting real need in our community. Recently we've also started a Carers Support Group. Anyone who has or is caring for someone living with dementia will know what a challenge it is. But with support, especially from those in a similar position, it can be just that bit more manageable. And it's with the support



of people and groups in the community – just like the Wickersley Ladies – that we can do all this. Thank you all so very much."













Ten of our amazing volunteers have been knitting for 30 mins each day in November to raise money for Dementia UK to fund 'Admiral Nurses' who support those caring for people living with dementia.

They've got through many balls of wool, knitted in some

unusual places and produced Christmas toppers for the many, chocolate oranges which are being sold to raise funds for our wonderful Winthrop!!

We expect to have made progress on this over the next few months to the extent that we can communicate and consult on this by April/May 2024. We hope when we do this you will be supportive of our plans and will le us have your views and comments on our proposals.

The Parish was all geared up for its first Walking Festival in early 2020 until Covid struck and unfortunately, just as all the leaflets arrived, it had to be cancelled!

#### So - we're going for it again in 2024!

We're making great progress on what we hope will be a Walking Festival with something for everyone, with the opportunity to walk in parts of Wickersley you may not have visited before and learn more about the rich history of our village. Already lots of people and groups have agreed to take part and so far we have 30 walks planned.
